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Transformational Da'wah: Responding to Secularism Trends Among Generation Z

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ABSTRACT

In the modern era, which is increasingly influenced by dominant secular culture, Generation Z faces significant challenges in maintaining and developing their spiritual and religious values. In this context, transformative preaching emerges as a promising approach to respond to this secular trend in a relevant and meaningful way. This research aims to explore the potential of transformative preaching in responding to the secular trend among Generation Z. We seek to understand how transformative preaching can assist Generation Z in finding meaning, depth, and spiritual direction in their lives, which are saturated with secular influences. The research methodology employed is qualitative, involving in-depth interviews and participatory observation with a sample group of Generation Z actively engaged in transformative preaching activities. Data analysis is conducted using an inductive approach to identify patterns and key findings. The main findings indicate that transformative preaching holds great potential in helping Generation Z overcome the challenges of secularism. The inclusive and open approach of transformative preaching creates a supportive environment for Generation Z to explore and deepen their understanding of spirituality. Additionally, the development of moral values and the utilization of social media and digital technology have proven effective in forming inclusive and supportive communities. This research makes a significant contribution to understanding the role of transformative preaching in responding to secular trends among Generation Z. These findings can aid in the development of more effective and relevant preaching programs to guide Generation Z in their search for meaning and spiritual direction in their complex lives.

ABSTRAK

Dalam era modern yang dipengaruhi oleh budaya sekulerisme yang semakin dominan, Generasi Z menghadapi tantangan besar dalam menjaga dan mengembangkan nilai-nilai spiritual dan agamanya. Dalam konteks ini, dakwah transformasional muncul sebagai pendekatan yang menjanjikan untuk merespons tren sekulerisme ini dengan cara yang relevan dan bermakna. Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengeksplorasi potensi dakwah transformasional dalam merespons tren sekulerisme pada Generasi Z. Kami ingin memahami bagaimana dakwah transformasional dapat membantu Generasi Z dalam menemukan makna, kedalaman, dan arah spiritual dalam kehidupan mereka yang dipenuhi dengan pengaruh sekuler. INTRODUCTION

Secularism, in social and political contexts, refers to the separation of religion from public life and state policies. It is often viewed as a product of modernity and liberalism, where individuals tend to separate their religious beliefs from political decisions and daily affairs. This phenomenon has gained significance in the current era of globalization, where secular values often dominate various aspects of life. The history of secularism in Islam highlights periods when secular thinking influenced the Muslim world, particularly during colonialism and post-colonialism in Arab countries and other Muslim-majority nations.¹

In Indonesia, secularism has become a heated topic in religious and political debates. Despite officially recognizing Pancasila as the state foundation that upholds religious values, secular practices can still be found in daily life, both in public policies and individual behaviors. This is evident in controversies surrounding issues such as religious freedom, LGBT rights, and the role of religion in politics.²

Secularism has been seen as a solution to religious radicalism by advocating for a clear separation between religion and the state (Intan, 2023). However, critics like Syed Muhammad Naquib Al-Attas have strongly opposed secularism, viewing the Islamization of contemporary science as a vocal form of criticism against secularism (Huringiin, 2022). The discourse on secularism in Indonesia has led to a fusion of secular and religious women's activism, where advocates draw on human rights and egalitarian interpretations of Islam to promote women's rights and equality.³

The influence of secularism on Generation Z (Gen Z) has become a serious concern. This generation, growing up amidst the digital information age and technological advancements, tends to be more open to various worldviews that may not align with traditional religious values. The trend of secularism among Gen Z is reflected in the increasing number of individuals identifying as non-religious, as well as in a broader acceptance of lifestyles that may contradict religious teachings.⁴

In response to this trend of secularism, the concept of Transformational Da'wah becomes increasingly relevant. Transformational Da'wah refers to efforts to convey religious messages with an approach that is relevant and adaptive to changing social and cultural contexts. This approach emphasizes the universal values of religion that can provide solutions to contemporary challenges while respecting pluralism and diversity.⁵

Research aims to explore the potential of Transformational Da'wah in responding to the trend of secularism among Gen Z. By understanding the dynamics between religious values and the social realities faced by young people, this research hopes to provide new insights into bridging the gap between tradition and modernity, as well as building a deeper understanding of the role of da'wah in touching the hearts and minds of Gen Z influenced by secular ideologies.6

METHOD

Metode penelitian yang digunakan adalah pendekatan kualitatif, dengan melakukan wawancara mendalam dan observasi partisipatif terhadap sekelompok sampel Generasi Z yang aktif terlibat dalam kegiatan dakwah transformasional. Through this approach, da'wah strives not only to invite individuals back to religious teachings but also to build social awareness and empathy towards others. 10

Transformational Da'wah is not just empty rhetoric but must also be applied in real activities. This can be done through various methods, such as inclusive religious education, community development, economic empowerment, and interfaith dialogue. This approach
